The Northeastern Province was established early in 1930 when James E. Allen was first appointed the Northeastern Province Polemarch by Archie A. Alexander before the Grand Chapter meeting that December in Philadelphia

Our province is made up of over 40 Undergraduate and 30 Alumni Chapters. We cover a geographical area spanning from the tip of New England in the north through Delaware in the south, and Pennsylvania in the west over to Germany and the United Kingdom.

The First Northeastern Province Polemarch James Egert Allen 1930

Brother James E. Allen, New York City, was selected to lead the Northeastern Province in 1930 by Grand Polemarch Archie A. Alexander who, along with other members of the Fraternity, remembered that at the 1930 Grand Chapter Meeting, **Brother Allen** spoke so enthusiastically about the Haitian liberation that the conclave



delegates passed a resolution authorizing a petition to President Herbert Hoover in support of the creation a commission which would include Black representation.

Prior to his appointment **Brother** Allen had served as Chairman of public relations for the New York Arrangements Committee; for nine months he was a columnist on the *Journal*, conducting "Books and Such". **Dr. Allen** served as Treasurer, lecturer and program coordinator of the New York Board for the Study of Afro-American Life and History from 1937

– 1957. He was Director of Historical Research for the Hollywood Race Relations Bureau as well as lecturer at Columbia, Syracuse, Ithaca and St. Johns Universities. He was president of the New York State Conference of NAACP Branches, active in the Boy Scouts of America, the YMCA, and the Society for the Study of Negro Life and History.

Brother Allen was awarded an honorary Doctor of Laws Degree from Johnson C. Smith University, where he served as a trustee for over twenty years.



The Second Northeastern Province Polemarch Harcourt Adderley Tynes, Sr. 1930 - 1933

Brother Harcourt Tynes followed a very circuitous route to the position of the first Polemarch of the Northeastern Province. At the pleasure of Grand Polemarch Archie A. Alexander, Brother Tynes served as the Province Polemarch of the Eastern Province during the years of 1928 and 1929. During that period the Eastern



Province's jurisdiction included chapters located in New York, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, Baltimore, Maryland, Washington, D. C. and Durham, North Carolina.

Brother Tynes was appointed to serve as the second Northeastern Province Polemarch by Grand Polemarch A. Moore Shearin.

Born in Nassau, Bahamas, he came to this country as a young man. A graduate of the City College of the City University of New York in 1922. **Brother Tynes** received in 1924 a Master's degree in

History and social science from Columbia University.

Harcourt Tynes was a widely respected educator in the New York Metropolitan area where he taught ninth grade pupils at Frederick Douglas Junior High School in Harlem, Social Studies and History from 1922 until his death.

A tireless civic worker, **Brother Tynes** had at various times been a member of the executive board of The New York branch of the N.A.A.C.P., a member of the executive board of the National Urban League and Vice Chairman of the Westchester, New York Council of the State Commission Against Discrimination.



The Third Northeastern Province Polemarch James Egert Allen 1933 - 1936

Brother James E. Allen, New York City, was selected to lead the Northeastern Province in 1933 by Grand Polemarch Dr. J. Jerome Peters who, along with other members of the Fraternity, remembered that at the 1930 Grand Chapter Meeting, **Brother Allen** spoke so enthusiastically about the Haitian liberation that the conclave delegates



passed a resolution authorizing a petition to President Herbert Hoover in support of the creation a commission which would include Black representation.

Prior to his appointment, **Brother Allen** had served as Chairman of Public Relations for the New York Arrangements Committee. For nine months he was a columnist on the *Journal*, conducting "Books and Such.. **Dr. Allen** also served as Treasurer, lecturer and Program Coordinator of the New York Board for the Study of Afro-American

Life and History from 1937 to 1957. He was Director of Historical Research for the Hollywood Race Relations Bureau as a well as lecturer at Columbia, Syracuse, Ithaca and St. Johns Universities. Additionally he was president of the New York State Conference of NAACP Branches, active in the Boy Scouts of America, the YMCA, and the Society for the Study of Negro Life and History.

Brother Allen was awarded an honorary Doctor of Laws Degree from Johnson C. Smith University, where he served as a trustee for over twenty years.



The Fourth Northeastern Province Polemarch I. Theodore Donaldson

1936 - 1939



Brother Donaldson, a charter member of New York Alumni, was one of the twelve original members of the Gamma Chapter at the University of Iowa when it started during the 1919-1920 school year. The Gamma Chapter ushered **Brother Donaldson** into the realm of Kappadom and his loyalty never waned.

He was affiliated with Chi, Omicron, Lambda and the New York Alumni Chapters. Noted for his extensive vocabulary and long speeches, **Brother Donaldson** won the admiration of all Kappamen for his loyalty and devotion to **Kappa Alpha Psi.**

He was elevated to the leadership of the Northeastern Province by Grand Polemarch Theophilus M. Mann.

Brother Donaldson was elected Senior Grand Vice Polemarch at the 31st Grand Chapter Meeting in 1941



The Fifth Northeastern Province Polemarch Murray Marvin, Jr.

1939 - 1941



Appointed by Grand Polemarch James E. Scott, **Brother Marvin**, of Philadelphia Alumni Chapter, was the first Northeastern Province Polemarch who was not from New York. An initiate of Tau Chapter at West Virginia State College Institute, **Brother Marvin** was a student art instructor and he assisted with the establishment of a mutual aid program at WVSCI in the interest of Kappamen needing assistance.

He was an Executive of the National Insurance Association based in Chicago, and he was a member of the Joint Negro Appeal and the Washington Park YMCA.





The Sixth Northeastern Province Polemarch Dr. William Leon Brown 1941 - 1943



Brother William L. Brown of the Philadelphia Alumni Chapter was appointed to lead the Northeastern Province in 1941 by Grand Polemarch Carl R. Johnson.


In 1971, the Philadelphia Alumni Chapter presented **Brother Brown** with a life membership as an expression of appreciation for his unselfish contributions to the chapter during its meager years.





The Seventh Northeastern Province Polemarch Rudolph G. Scott

1943 - 1945



Brother Rudolph Scott was a charter member of the New York Alumni Chapter. Along with other illustrious members of the chapter, including past and future NEP Province Polemarchs Ernest Dimetry and I. T. Donaldson, **Brother Scott** was one of the original sponsors of the Kappa Kostume Karnival that became the unique and outstanding New York Fall Ball, now called the Annual Krimson and Kream Ball.





The Eighth Northeastern Province Polemarch I. Theodore Donaldson


1945 - 1946



Brother Donaldson, held the office of Northeastern Province Polemarch twice .

He was a catalyst in the acquisition of the Kappa Kastle of the New York Alumni Chapter. **Brother Donaldson,** the first Northeastern Province Polemarch from the New York Alumni Chapter, is said to have contributed the initial five dollars toward the purchase of an alumni house; additionally, he encouraged the chapter to allocate a portion of the dues for this fund.

Polemarch Donaldson received the DDS degree from the School of Dentistry at the University of Pennsylvania. He distinguished himself as one of New York's outstanding dentists and maintained one of the most up-to-date, well-equipped offices and a very choice clientele.





Brother Enos S. Andrews, a 1928 Lambda Chapter initiate, and a member of the Philadelphia Alumni Chapter, was appointed to the position of Northeastern Province Polemarch by Judge Augustus G. Parker, twelfth Grand Polemarch. Prior to assuming this leadership position, **Brother Andrews** served as a reporter of the *Journal of Kappa Alpha Psi*. He was instrumental in having the new *Kappa Hymn* printed and distributed.

Richard Lee Snow, Sr., then Keeper of Records for the Philadelphia Alumni Chapter, wrote of **Brother Andrews** in the March 1992 issue of **The Diamond** *Newsletter:* "Brother Andrews was a life-long Philadelphian with 64 years as an active Kappaman. He played a significant role in the founding of several Chapters, including the Dynamic Delta Theta Chapter at the Pennsylvania State University."



The Tenth Northeastern Province Polemarch William M. Chilsholm 1951 - 1953



Grand Polemarch Frank M. Summers, a prominent attorney of East St. Louis, appointed a charter member of the Brooklyn Alumni Chapter - which became the Brooklyn-Long Island Alumni Chapter to the position of Northeastern Province Polemarch.

Characterized as a "virtual neophyte in the office of Province Polemarch, **Brother Chisholm's** outstanding leadership abilities led to his eventual election as Senior Grand Vice Polemarch at the 44th Grand Chapter Meeting in Washington, DC. He was reelected to the position of Senior Grand Vice Polemarch 4 times and after that service he searved as a member of the Grand Board of Directors.



The Eleventh Northeastern Province Polemarch Ernest L. Dimitry

1953 - 1957



Brother Dimitry, New York Alumni, was one of the first initiates in 1925 of the Omega Chapter at Drake University, Des Moines, Iowa. As special editor of *The Kappa Alpha Psi Journal*, **Brother Dimitry** assembled an excellent pre-convention issue for the 24th Grand Chapter meeting in New York in 1934. He is noted for his comment about Grand Polemarch Peters: "*Brother J. J. Peters took advantage of the abilities of various men throughout the fraternity in making official appointments and stimulating them to take pride in rehabilitating the clan.*" Brother Peters' responded: "*Pride in accomplishment is a growing theme that permeates every nook and cranny of the organization. The membership must assume greater responsibility for the fraternity's rehabilitation.*"



The Twelfth Northeastern Province Polemarch

1958 - 1959



Brother Wingate was a retired Justice of the New York State Supreme Court and a former Executive Director of the New York Urban League. In 1961, when Congressman Adam Clayton Powell became Chairman of the House Committee on Education and Labor, his first order of business was to recruit **Brother Wingate** to be associate chief counsel. With the support of Congressman Charles Rangel, he was appointed a New York City Criminal Courts Judge in 1975. **Brother Wingate** initiated the annual Urban League's Whitney M. Young Football Classic and helped organize The One Hundred Black Men service organization. In 1960 **Brother Wingate** received the **Northeastern Province Distinguished Service Award** which is now named the James M. Kidd Award.. His famous quote is well known in Kappadom: *"Kappa gave me more than I ever gave it."*





Brother Jackson W. Campbell was only appointed Northeastern Province Polemarch one time. He is the longest serving Polemarch to date.

Initiated at Chi Chapter, **Brother Campbell** is a charter member of the Boston Alumni Chapter where he has served as Polemarch and Keeper of Records. Educated at Virginia State College and Boston University **Brother Campbell** was employed as a Field Investigator for the Massachusetts Division of Employment Security. Twice appointed to the position of Northeastern Province Polemarch,

Brother Jackson Campbell served a short period as a member of the Grand Board of Directors and was the 2nd Executive Director of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc.






Brother Lancelot Tynes was appointed to the position of Northeastern Province Polemarch shortly after the fifty-third Grand Chapter Meeting in Boston in 1965. It was during this time that the Fraternity was concerned with the serious problems encountered by Black teachers and administrators because of discrimination in job assignments connected with the integration of public schools. The Fraternity was also cognizant of the practices of some Realtors and landlords of charging excessive rents for substandard housing. **Brother Tynes** strongly and aggressively encouraged the Chapters in the Northeastern Province to subscribe to the Fraternity's resolution to seek out and destroy discrimination wherever it existed



The Fifteenth Northeastern Province Polemarch Dr. Albert G. Oliver

1969 - 1974



Dr. Albert G. Oliver past Northeastern Province Polemarch was born and educated in New York City. He received a baccalaureate and masters degrees from the City University of New York and completed a Ph.D. at St. John's University in 1978.

He served as a Lieutenant in the Korean War from 1951-1953 and received numerous awards. He retired as a Major from the US Army Reserve.

As a distinguished and dedicated educator, he spent most of his professional life in the pursuit of excellence in the New York City Board of Education. At the time of his death, he was the director of community school district affairs. To all of his endeavors he brought a wealth of experience and knowl-edge.

Brother Oliver was the recipient of the Morrisania Education Council's award as The Outstanding Principal of The Year in District 8, Bronx, New York. The award was given on April 18, 1975 and presented to Oliver by Livingston R. Wingate, recently appointed a judge to the New York City Civil Court.

Dr. Oliver was equally devoted to Operation Crossroads Africa. From 1972-1981 he served as the chairman of the Crossroads board of directors.

As a stalwart Life Member, he served with distinction as Polemarch of the Omicron Chapter from 1954-1956.

His time and energy were contributed to numerous organizations. He served on boards of several of these including the Richard Allen Center for Cultural Arts, the One Hundred Black Men and the East Bronx Chapter of the NAACP. His membership in local and national organizations were extensive.

Dr. Oliver was recipient of more than 100 awards and professional honors that attested to his skills, his commitment and his labors on behalf of his community, his family and the brotherhood of man.



The Sixteenth Northeastern Province Polemarch Irving L. Briddell, Jr. 1974 - 1979



In 1974, **Brother Irving Briddell**, **Jr.** became the Northeastern Province's Fifteenth Polemarch, succeeding Brother Albert G. Oliver. He immediately became very involved in the mechanics of establishing rapport with the chapters of the Province and developing a good administration. Under his leadership, the Province Board of Directors approved several innovative programs: The Guide Right Competition, a new Achievement Committee Program, the publication of the first *Diamond Newsletter* in February 1975, and the implementation of a job bank for employment opportunities. In 1992, James M. Kidd recipient **Brother Irving L. Briddell** was awarded the Northeastern Province's Alumni Achievement Award for his sponsorship of legislation that resulted in a significant increase in the participation of minority and women businesses in the State of New Jersey's procurements and contracts.



The Seventeenth Northeastern Province Polemarch James M. Kidd

1979 - 1981




Past Keeper of Records and Polemarch of the Trenton (NJ) Alumni Chapter, **Brother Kidd** was an initiate of Alpha Xi Chapter at Florida A. & M. University. After several years in public education, **Brother Kidd** became an officer in the United States Air Force from which he retired in 1971 with the rank of Captain.

From 1971 to 1975 he was Supervisor of Veterans Education with the Vocational Division of the State of New Jersey.

Upon assuming leadership of the Northeastern Province in 1979, **Brother Kidd** outlined eight objectives of his administration, among which the most salient points were the establishment of a Student Revolving Loan Fund, the development of a model C. R. Wilson Undergraduate Leadership Training Program, and the revival of the publication *The Diamond Newsletter*. His goal was the raising of the bar for the Public Endowment Fund as a means of keeping the *Kappa Journal* at the top of all fraternal and sorority publications.



The Eighteenth Northeastern Province Polemarch Melvin Taylor 1981 - 1982



Brother Melvin Taylor of New York Alumni was appointed as the successor of Northeastern Province Polemarch James M. Kidd. A native of Harlem, New York, **Brother Taylor** was initiated into the Omicron Chapter in 1955 while a student at New York City College. He served his undergraduate chapter as Polemarch, Vice Polemarch, Board Member and undergraduate advisor with the New York Alumni Chapter.

He was a product of the New York City public school and college systems and served honorably in the U.S. Army.

He began his career as a teacher of science and mathematics. He went on to administer The Upward Bound Program at Fordham University and later directed the same program at Yale University. He also directed The College Discovery Program at New York's City University. Subsequently, he became the principal of Benjamin Franklin High School for eleven years and held the same post at Washington Irving High School for six years. He retired because of poor health in 1986 after twenty-eight years of service.

He died October 10th 1987. His professional, community and religious affiliations are evidence of his commitment to helping others. He was: Executive Board Member of New York Principals' Association; Executive Board Member of the Association of Black Educators of New York; Pan-Hellenic Council member; Director of the Robert Francis Learning Center of Canaan Baptist Church; local delegate to the Governor's Conference on Children; state delegate to a similar White House Conference; Member of the Board of Directors of Harlem Interfaith Counseling Service and the Barbara Solomon Dance Company; Scholarship Board member of Canaan Baptist Church.

He left to mourn his loss a wife, Barbara, two daughters, Laverne and H Annette, a son, Kimailii, two grandchildren, his sister, Sarah, and an aunt.



The Nineteenth Northeastern Province Polemarch Richard A. Scott

1982 - 1986



Brother Richard A. Scott, appointed by Grand Polemarch Robert L. Gordon and became the 19th Northeastern Province Polemarch in 1982. **Brother Scott** was a member of the Harrisburgh Alumni Chapter and a strong advocate of "*That Good Old Kappa Spirit*", which he described as "*a personal sensibility of Fraternity membership characterized by a mature attitude towards Brothers, loyalty to purpose and ideals, and the acceptance of RESPONSIBILITY for the Fraternity's meaningful survival.*"

Brother Scott declared that the Kappa Spirit is acquired through clear understanding of and conformance with Fraternity Purpose, Ritual and law and by the subservience of selfish interests for the common good through sacrificial cooperation with the best aims of the Fraternity

Brother Scott also served on the Grrand Board of Directors of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc.



The Twentieth Northeastern Province Polemarch Harold B. Adams

1986 - 1988



Brother Adams, Philadelphia Alumni Chapter, was initiated into the Gamma Omega Chapter at Cheyney State University in 1954. He served as Vice Polemarch in both Gamma Omega and Philadelphia Alumni Chapters. **Brother Adams** was the national coordinator of the Big Brother/Big Sister project. He has been Northeastern Province Guide Right Chairman, Keeper of Records and a member of its Achievement Committee. Among the objectives that **Brother Adams** established for the Northeastern Province are: (1) improving communications in the Province by publishing three editions of the **Diamond Newsletter** rather than one, plus the establishment and publication of the Province Alert Administrative Bulletin; (2) developing an operations manual for the undergraduate chapters; and (3) through the Guide Right Program the Province will strive to correct two major problems plaguing the communities: drug abuse and teenage pregnancy.

The Twenty-first Northeastern Province Polemarch Samuel C. Hamilton

1988 - 1991



Brother Samuel C. Hamilton was one of the four Province Polemarchs appointed by Brother Ulysses McBride effective September 1, 1988. Brother Hamilton, former Polemarch of the Hartford Alumni Chapter, was initiated into the Gamma Kappa Chapter at Clark College in 1963 and had served as Province Senior Vice Polemarch and a member of its Board of Directors. At the time of his appointment, he was Deputy Director of the Hartford Economic Development Corporation. Concerned that all chapters were not taking active roles in the three important components of the Fraternity (Guide Right, Reclamation and Achievement), Brother Hamilton declared that every Chapter should have an operating Guide Right Program. He exhorted each Chapter in the Northeastern Province to take an active part in the reclamation of our non-sustaining membership. Brother Hamilton called upon the NEP Chapters to recognize achievement in all areas and at all levels of the Fraternity. To attain these objectives, Brother Hamilton established the Council of Northeastern Province Polemarchs to monitor the progress in each of these critical areas. At the 70th Grand Chapter Meeting, Brother Hamilton was elected Grand Keeper of Records and Exchequer. This illustrious and dedicated Kappaman of the Northeastern Province was the 30th Grand Polemarch of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Incorporated.

The Twenty-second Northeastern Province Polemarch Herman B. Thomas, Jr. 1991 - 1995



Brother Thomas was appointed by the 27th Grand Polemarch, Robert L. Harris, to lead the Northeastern Province. He replaced Samuel Hamilton who had been elected to the position of Grand Keeper of Records and Exchequer at the 70th Grand Chapter. During his tenure, Brother Thomas aggressively addressed issues of major concern to the Fraternity as a whole with particular attention being given to (1) social action as it relates to health care issues that impact upon African Americans; (2) the survival of the African-American male; (3) zero tolerance of hazing in any form; and (4) increased emphasis on the role of the Undergraduate Chapter Advisor. **Brother Thomas** is a recipient of the Northeastern Province's highest recognition, the James M. Kidd award.



The Twenty-third Northeastern Province Polemarch Dennis T. Golden

1995 - 1999



Dennis T. Golden was appointed to the position of Northeastern Province Polemarch by Grand Polemarch Ronald Young shortly after the close of the 73rd Grand Chapter meeting. **Brother Golden** was at that time at International Headquarters in the position of Assistant Executive Secretary for Programs. One of the major goals of **Brother Golden** at the helm of the Northeastern Province was to embrace the new theme of the Grand Polemarch, *"Kappatalize on Opportunity"*. Each Chapter was urged to take advantage of every opportunity that was presented to reclaim, reactivate, and re-motivate as many brothers as possible. During the Province Council Meeting of March 26-29, 1998, the Northeastern Province initiated over 130 new Brothers into the Fraternity.



The Twenty-fourth Northeastern Province Polemarch Dr. Tilghman L. Moore 1999 - 2002



Brother Tilghman L. Moore was appointed 24th Northeastern Province Polemarch March 1, 1999. Brother Moore considered Guide Right as the most important program chapters have. So said Brother Moore in his last "*State of the Province Address*": "*More than ever, Kappa men are needed in our communities to provide role modes for young black men. With black on black crime at an all time high and more black men in jails than in college, the need is critical.*" Striving for unity throughout the Fraternity, **Polemarch Moore** urged his Kappa Brothers to "put personal and petty differences and internal politics aside and join with him to stay the course until we accomplish our goal of a new direction and increased service to all humanity for our Fraternity."

The Twenty-fifth Northeastern Province Polemarch

2002 - 2007



Brother Michael Brewington was appointed to the position of Northeastern Province Polemarch in 2002 by Grand Polemarch Howard L. Tutman, Jr.

Brother Brewington is currently a Foodservice Salesman and Purchasing Agent, for D. M. Rothman Company, Inc, and has been employed in this industry for the last 24 years. The company distributes and sells domestic and exotic produce throughout the New York metropolitan area, and surrounding states. He is responsible for coordinating the sale of wholesale foods with other foodservice companies, purveyors, supermarket chains, federal-state-city institutions, hotels, hospitals and local establishments. Michael began his career in the foodservice industry as a sales representative for Proctor & Gamble.

Michael is native New Yorker who grew up in South Carolina. He holds a Bachelor's of Science from Clemson University. He is member of various civic organizations, but it most active with Ancient Free & Accepted Masons. He is a Past Worshipful Master of the Central Star Lodge #18, and Past Worthy Patron of Martha Chapter #79 O.E.S. He currently serves on the Budget Committee for the Star of Bethlehem Grand Chapter of the Order of the Eastern Stars and on the Central Star

Lodge Scholarship Committee. He also does a great deal of work with Boy Scout Troop 50/Cub Scout Pack 50 in Elmont, NY, including organizing annual trips outside of New York, that are designed to not only educate the youth but to expose them to new environments.
