



It was during our annual chapter retreat in 2018 that we developed the framework for A Mid-Summer Dream, The All-White Affair (AMSD) as the primary fundraising vehicle. This party with a purpose along with our community partnership with RMHSNJ would be the catalyst for our ability to support children and families. The best way to accomplish this initiative was our chapter taking part in their Adopt-a-Room Program".

The Adopt a Room Program specifically allowed our chapter to design and create a comfortable and relaxing space for the families of children who are undergoing treatment or surgery - in many instances to save their lives. It was unanimously agreed upon that our decorative theme would be "The Avengers". As part of the program The Avengers Room will enable families to stay together during these stressful times providing a sense of normalcy. What they demonstrate daily is the realization that you don't need to have superpowers to be considered a superhero.

The Ronald McDonald House is a home away from home enabling family members a place of peace and refuge as they focus on the health and well-being of their loved ones. Each year approximately 800 families from around the world have receive temporary housing, meals, and support while their children receive lifesaving, specialized treatment at local hospitals. Over the past three decades the RMHSNJ has served more than 24,000 families.

From neighboring chapters to NEP Polemarch Craig Chisholm as well as Grand Polemarch Thomas Battles you will see brothers throw up a "X" and refer to these brothers as LoS Nupes. Los Nupes stands for League of Shadows Nupes. The moniker hearkens back to the days when going into some of the most hardened neighborhoods was met with steely glances from residents who would always say from a distance, "what is KAY"? Brothers came to realize it did not matter if people knew who we were as long as the work being done was impactful to the community.

Over 85% of the chapter is made up of reclaimed Brothers. Many of the Brothers come home when they see the Brothers toiling in the streets working with the community. Over the past ten years LoS Nupes have been recognized by every level of Borough, City and State government. Thousands have been fed through pantry, street distribution and home delivery. The homeless have been provided clothing and hundreds of children are given toys.

The Brothers of Bronx Alumni are 3-time consecutive winners of alumni chapter of the year award. This past year the chapter was awarded the award as a medium chapter for the first time. If Brothers are looking for a place to put in work look no further than the Bronx. LoS Nupes will be out in the streets serving the community!



While immediate past Polemarch Lee being a life-long community organizer gladly participated in this important endeavor he was further encouraged by the leadership of GHQ to register voters. Nobody Leaves Mid-Hudson a grassroots community organization that brings together the people most directly impacted by injustice to fight around issues that most deeply affect our community and to challenge the systems of power that are at the root of these problems, organized the voter registration effort. Co-founder and Executive Director, Jonathan Bix, stated, "In the four months before the 2018 midterm election, Nobody

Jayvin Irby, graduating senior and President of #MontclairKL, describes his experience of "The Ancestral River" as follows; 'Walking down the same path some of our ancestors followed to their last bath [before being sold in to slavery] I felt connected. Seeing the river itself, and trying to imagine the torture they had to go through forever changed my life.'
